Pastor's Ponderings

Isaiah 43:19 - Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

Change is always challenging. Even good and healthy changes, like a graduation, require major adjustments that can be quite stressful. And most changes are a mixture of both good and bad, upside and downside.

When the prophet Isaiah spoke the words quoted above to the people of Israel, they were headed into exile in Babylon. Cast out from their promised land after generations of unfaithfulness. Driven into exile after shameful defeat and great loss of life. Clearly, as unpleasant a change as any group of people could face. Yet, God spoke these words of comfort and hope, "I am doing a new thing... I will make a way."

St. Peter, Norwalk is entering a period of change. Unlike Israel's change, your change has occurred for a healthy reason. Your beloved pastor of 28 years has been called to a different vocation, a different type of service to Christ's church. He will still be part of your spiritual care as your District President, but there will be a change in your week-to-week life as a congregation. You enter into a vacancy period and turn your eyes and efforts to the call of your next pastor, while still concerned for the care of each member daily and weekly.

As your Circuit Visitor, it is my role to help provide care and direction during this time of change. Please allow me to share a few observations that I hope will encourage you:

1) Nothing is unknown to God – God knew, from before he created the earth, that you would face this circumstance. Let that sink in a moment. From before time existed, He knew that St. Peter Lutheran Church in Norwalk, CT would bid farewell to Pastor Bob Beinke on August 28, 2022. He wasn't alarmed, surprised, or caught off-guard. He is the beginning and the end, the Alpha and Omega. He knew this was coming, and he knows exactly what comes next. However...

- 2) **Much is unknown to us** Human knowledge is limited. This is part of what makes change so stressful: we have to make decisions with less-than-perfect data in circumstances we've never faced before. In the face of these limitations, the three human stress responses emerge: fight, flight, or freeze. Some will be tempted to fight tooth and nail for control or to ensure that their view carries the day; some may be tempted to leave, concerned for the future or simply seeing this as a natural transition time; some may be tempted to freeze, unsure of any course and fearful of mis-steps. All are understandable responses, but none is an entirely faithful response. Instead...
- 3) We must trust God There are established steps for a congregation to follow during a vacancy: a self-study, determination of the qualities desired in a called pastor, evaluation of available candidates, issuance of a call... Each of these steps have some resources and advice connected with them. But, ultimately, we don't place our trust in any procedure. Our trust is in our Father, who made us; our Lord, who redeemed us with his precious blood; the Spirit, which reminds us of all that Christ has taught and guides us into all truth. We trust that God knew this was coming and He knows where it is going. We cling even more greatly to His promises in his Word and to His means of grace delivered to us. When we are reminded of this, we...
- 4) Remember: we know the end of the story We know that Christ shall return, triumphant over sin and death and the devil. Every knee will bow and every tongue confess that he is Lord. He shall make all things new and all who have called on His name in faith shall be saved. We will enter into the feast of the Lamb in His kingdom which shall have no end. We may not know what next week or next month will hold,
- 5) but we know where history shall end, and it is glorious.

This brings with it both a comfort and a challenge. The challenge is this: If you, the saints at St. Peter, Norwalk, trust to your own wisdom, experiences, and desires to guide your next steps, those steps will inevitably falter and fail. We are humans, limited in our experiences and locked in battle with our sinful nature which so easily entangles. We fight, we flee, we freeze.

But the comfort is this: If you, the saints at St. Peter, Norwalk, humbly trust in God to guide you... If you trust that He will make use of your wisdom, experiences, and desires, but may also direct in new and unexpected ways... If you trust that He shall continue to nourish and refresh you by His Word and Sacrament... If you continue to lift up your pastors in prayer – your former pastor, your future pastors, and all the pastors who assist in caring for you during your vacancy... If you remember that He is same, yesterday, today, and forever... Then I am confident that you will see proof after proof of God's love and care for you, as individuals and as a congregation. I am convinced that you will see reminder after reminder that the same God who was born in a manger and died on a cross and rose from a tomb and ascended to the right hand of God is indeed at work for you and in you and through you.

Change is hard. Israel could testify to this and so can you. But times of change can deepen our faith in wonderful and unshakable ways. I look forward to the day, hopefully in the near future, when we can look back at these days and say with joy: God has made a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.
